ALLERGY AWARE AT BRUNY ISLAND DISTRICT SCHOOL

Thank you families for your support with our implementation of becoming an Allergy Aware School. Your support with this is greatly appreciated.

We currently have two students attending our school who are at risk of **anaphylaxis**.

Triggers for these students include: nuts and kiwi fruit.

The school has implemented a number of strategies to help eliminate the risk of anaphylaxis and this will be documented in a policy that will be shared soon.

Parents are asked to also help us eliminate the risk by:

- Children are instructed and reminded to not share food and drink:
- Parents send up to date information about their child's allergies;
- Parents avoid sending messy food, such as egg sandwiches and grated cheese in sandwiches;
- Parents identify on hot lunch orders if their child has allergies;

Parents do not send nuts or kiwi fruit.

OUR VALUES

With regular reading you will not only support your child to build their language and love for literacy, but also begin the important learning required to support comprehension development.


Your child will be rewarded with a certificate for every 20 reading sessions completed, and a book prize for 100 reading sessions.

MATHEMATICS


We started 2021 with a strong focus on Mathematics. Each of the teachers were given the text: *Becoming the Maths Teacher You Wish You'd Had* as a holiday read, and this was discussed on our professional learning day before school started.



This text has become the foundation

for our work this year by challenging us to think about the culture we create for the subject of Mathematics. How do we talk about it? How do we show it's relevance? How do we inspire creative thinking and engagement with problem solving and reward effort over correct answers.

We decided that interviewing each student about their ideas and beliefs about Mathematics was an important way to start this focus. Throughout Week I our teachers have been interviewing each student and the data has been very interesting. Here is a snapshot of what we heard.



This snapshot is now on display in our school courtyard and it is our hope that we can improve this data throughout the year.

It is also our aim to work in partnership with families with our focus on Mathematics. In the coming weeks we will be offering families a number of ways to engage with Mathematics and work in partnership with us to support





your child with their learning.

We hope many of you are able to do this work with us.

WHAT DO WE VALUE?



As an introduction to the implementation of our new school values, we started the year by asking students the big question: *What do you value?* This will be the overarching question that will guide our whole school inquiry for the first half of the year.

Each of our students (and staff members) were asked to create a canvas display of the things that they really value and of things that are important to them.

encourages us to be reflective about what is important to us, why they are important and make connections with other people. It has been wonderful to see students looking at the canvas squares that are on display and say "Oh, I didn't know you liked....".
