Dear Families,

Welcome to the latest school newsletter.

This week our families with children from Prep to Year 6 will receive a *Primary Progress Report*. This report provides families with a brief general comment and a rating against 14 learner behaviours. The report is designed to provide a quick overview for families about how your child has settled into the new school year and to encourage a conversation with us if you have any concerns.

Over the coming weeks we will be busy planning for some big events. We can finally confirm the Year 3-6 swimming lessons will be going ahead as planned with travel up and back to Hobart for the first 2 days (25 and 26 March) and a Swim Camp for the last 3 days (29, 30 and 31 March). We are finalising the details now and we will be sharing information with families in the coming days.

Our Year 3 and Year 5 students will be engaging with NAPLAN Testing at the start of Term 2. To prepare our students for this we will be having a practice NAPLAN test on the 22 and 24 March. This will ensure students are comfortable with the testing format and the various types of questions they could be asked. The results of the NAPLAN tests are just one piece of the puzzle that help inform our educators about the strengths and areas for development for our students. We use this in conjunction with many other tests and assessments to inform our teaching and learning program.

Next week we will also be hosting Indigital on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. This is due to the Microsoft Minecraft Challenge the 4-5's won last year and we are very much looking forward to this event.

You might remember this moment from 2020? This was the moment we were announced as the winners of the NAIDOC Minecraft Education Challenge and won a prize worth \$12,000. We won this by responding to the question "How might we build sustainable schools, cities, towns or communities in 2030 using Indigenous science, technology, engineering, arts and maths?"

Our prize includes the face-to-face delivery of the Indigital Schools program, including teacher training, access to software and a three-day workshop led by Indigital.

Indigital's mission is to close the digital divide between Indigenous people and non-Indigenous peoples, by providing a meaningful pathway for Indigenous people into the digital economy and the creation of future technologies.

We have been very well supported by the Department of Education who have supported us with both Todd Sculthorpe (Project Officer—Inclusive Curriculum) and Aboriginal Elder Aunty Julie Dunlop who will be attending Bruny Island District School for two days of this workshop.

We are very much looking forward to this unique and exciting opportunity.

reading too.




