#### **INDIGITAL SCHOOLS**

It was an incredible week of learning and engagement last week as we embarked on a workshop with Indigital Schools—given to us as a prize from the NAIDOC Minecraft Education Challenge of 2020.

We welcomed Aboriginal Community Elder Aunty Julie Dunlop and Todd Sculthorpe (DoE) who shared with us an Indigenous story of our local history and the importance of knowing our past to help inform our future.



The students were then asked to take a character or element from the story and use this to create an augmented reality 2D and then 3D character.





Our students then used the Minecraft Education platform to

demonstrate their understanding of the Indigenous Story through a digital creation of the landscape with non-playing characters informing viewers of the key points they wanted to share.






Indigital Schools also presented to our K-P-I and 2-3 classes and showed them both the augmented reality technology and the very popular mixed reality headset.

**WHEN: SATURDAY 24 APRIL** 





Tennis is a very challenging sport, but students have risen to that challenge and are enjoying a variety of games and drills to learn the skills for tennis.





#### **LITTLE PENGUINS**

Three- year old Julian, asks, 'Why am I painting the rocks, Mrs. Hearn?' 'Why do you think, Julian?' As quick as a flash, he replies, 'The rocks will keep the wallabies and the kangaroos and the other animals away'. 'Do you think there are some more reasons why we should paint the rocks and place them round the tree, outside?' Some think time and Julian repeats his main purpose once again. His response is so typical of almost all children. They know so much and given the chance will express themselves very well and in many different ways. Additionally, Julian's response demonstrates how clear and logical and smart three yearolds are and how they can connect prior knowledge to new situations.

So, Julian is spot on. The children are claiming their learning space – making it their own. Additionally, the painted rocks create beauty and develop an aesthetic sense. As a general principle, all children who understand the purpose of what they are doing, can focus for long periods of time on their task with care and astonishing concentration.






We are continuing to focus on gross motor skills on Wednesdays and fine motor skills on Friday sessions, as both are critical for children's development.

Naturally, central to our programme is language. Being read to and hearing great stories by wonderful authors immerses children in one all- important way of communication speaking. This is why we are so passionate about reading and selecting truly wonderful stories for them to hear. In our programme, students access stories either in the library or in reading circle time. In the last two weeks, we've read and dramatized 'Pete the Cat'. This character's upbeat and positive attitude enthrals young audiences and shines through all his adventures. In 'Pete the Cat and his Four Groovy Buttons', does Pete cry, when he loses all four of them? 'Goodness No!' Then, in 'Pete the Cat I Love My White Shoes', despite stepping in

shoes, but he keeps singing his song!
