In the final weeks of Term 1, our Year 3-6 students participated in their yearly Learn to Swim program at the Doone Kennedy Hobart Aquatic Centre. The program not only teaches the basics of learning to swim but it also teaches our students important water safety skills; including boat safety. We are incredibly thankful to the parents that joined us and supported us during Swim Camp 2021 and to our teachers Rory and Claire who gave up so much of their own time to support this incredible learning opportunity for our students.

In the coming weeks we will begin the nationwide NAPLAN testing for students in Year 3 and Year 5. We have prepared our students with the various testing formats and we successfully completed an online practice test in Term 1. We look forward to sharing with our families the results of the NAPLAN testing once this information is released later in the year.

SWIM CAMP

Congratulations to all of our students for a wonderful Swim Camp this year.



Just prior to the Easter term break, our Year 3—6 students participated in the annual Learn to Swim program at the Doone Kennedy Hobart Aquatic Centre.



We spent two days travelling up and back to Hobart for our swim lessons and then 2 nights and 3 days staying at Orana Guide Camp in Lauderdale.



Our students experienced two swimming lessons each day and focused on basic learn to swim skills, rescue techniques and boat safety.

Whilst staying at Orana, we had access to the beautiful Roaches Beach and local experiences for our students to explore and learn from.



We visited the Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery and explored the ningina tunapri exhibition. This exhibition explores the journey of Tasmanian Aboriginal people and is a celebration of all Tasmanian Aboriginal generations.

On another afternoon we visited the stunning MACq01 Hotel on Hobart's waterfront and completed an educational history tour with the Master Storyteller exploring European Settlement and Hunter Street precinct.



MAJOR EXCURSION UPDATE

In previous years, our senior students have participated in a biannual major excursion to Canberra.

Due to COVID19, we have been unable to consider any interstate travel. The current advice from the Department of Education is this:

"The Department will continue with our conservative approach to interstate travel with no interstate travel being approved at this time. Schools should be cautious about planning any interstate trips for students in 2022."

It is due to these current restrictions that we will be unable to offer any major excursions-including a trip to Canberra in 2021 or even 2022 at this stage.

We are working together to consider alternative ways to provide authentic travel experiences for our students that are within Tasmania and more information will be shared with families with regards to this as soon as it becomes available.

From the sales of our wraps and merchandise, we raised approximately \$2,500 and we had many people come back to us to tell us how delicious their food was.




