Welcome to the latest school newsletter.

Last week our educators modelled the school values of *Aspiration* and *Growth* as we participated in a full day professional learning workshop with Rob Vingerhoets.

We spent the morning listening to Rob share with us some key teaching strategies for developing mathematical understanding and then we watched as he modelled a lesson with each of our classes. Our afternoon was then spent debriefing and asking questions about the way he organised the lesson and taught the students. We were truly inspired after the day with Rob and we look forward to implementing some of our learning in the weeks to come.

To support the rich focus we have had on Mathematics this year, we have purchased a number of new picture books that share a mathematical story. We have looked far and wide to find the best mathematical picture books available and we are very pleased with our purchases. The books were shared with our team on Friday and we have already started talking about the different ways we could use these in the classroom to teach mathematical concepts.

WHAT WE TEACH - UPDATED



THE FOLLOWING HAS BEEN PROVIDED TO FAMILIES BY THE **DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION:**


Coming into the cold and flu season, it's important that we all continue to keep healthy and safe. To ensure we can keep on top of COVID and also cold and flu, make sure you:

- * applying restrictions to large gatherings of adults and encouraging physical distancing

Hello everyone!

In Week 6 of Term 2, from Monday the 24th - 26th of May we are having a visit from Oral Health Services Tasmania (OHST) for the Fissure Sealant and Fluoride

Varnish Program for all students at Bruny Island District School.

This important preventative health care program is supported by evidence-based research and helps to protect your child's teeth and prevent the formation of tooth decay.

Did you know?

Dental decay is the second most costly diet-health related disease in Australia

Tooth decay and gum disease can lead to tooth loss

> These conditions are preventable

This is such a wonderful opportunity, because the service is offered within school hours, and is provided free through Medicare. The program also includes free oral health screening and, if needed, referral on to one of the dental clinics if further treatment is required.

Students in all classes have been sent home a form which has further information about the program, and a registration and medical consent form.

Wednesday is School Banking day and students can bring in their weekly deposit. If your child has lost their book, please contact the school office or visit any Commonwealth Bank branch.


LAUNCHING INTO LEARNING




RUN CLUB - STARTING SOON!

Every Monday morning Orson's dad Aaron Archer will meet with kids who want to join in on the school oval at 8:30am – 8:50am.


Just bring along your running shoes and join in. No registration required.
