#### **EXTERNAL SCHOOL REVIEW**

Last week (October 26 and 27), Bruny Island District School were part of the External School Review process.

The purpose of the review is to support schools to raise student achievement and sustain high performance. The process is intended to support schools to strengthen their focus on learning and provides independent feedback about our strengths and areas to focus on. Principals then use the findings of the review to work with the community and Learning Services to develop clear actions to move the school forward.

The Commendations provide a clear line of sight from everyone involved: Principal, teaching staff, non-teaching staff, families, and students. Some of the findings:

- The school is driving a strong improvement agenda
- Significant positive changes in the school
- Leadership which is described as 'inspirational' and 'supportive'
- High levels of trust across the school community and beyond
- A united and committed team with authentic and positive relationships between each other and with community
- A school wide commitment to purposeful, successful learning for all (students, families, staff)
- Individuality is recognised and celebrated
- We are all part of professional learning community

These commendations are significant. We must all take a moment to reflect on this and be proud of the part we have each played to helped us achieve this outcome. This is not the work of a few, this is the work of all of us.

The final report will be prepared and shared with us before the end of term.

I would like to acknowledge and say thanks to everyone involved with the External School Review. It is an unusual process and it required flexibility with the number of changes that happened across the two days



and a high level of courage to be observed and interviewed by the reviewers. Everyone did an amazing job!




Imagine a playground designed specifically for children from only a few months old, to age 5.
