






BRUNY ISLAND BIRD FESTIVAL


The Curators Award for the Bruny Island District School Bird Festival Exhibition was awarded to Silas Paxton for the following reasons.

Silas' painting, "40 Spotted Pardalote", captured the "essence" of the tiny endangered bird.

A Pardalote nests in dark little holes, it is very difficult to see in amongst the dark foliage of the Eucalyptus Viminalis that is its favourite habitat, and it's 40 spots are almost impossible to count when it flutters from one branch to another.

Silas might not have been conscious of including these aspects of the bird in his painting, but his instinct for the innate nature of this little creature is obvious.



COVID-19 SYMPTOMS TO LOOK OUT FOR.

Thank you to our entire school community for your cooperation this term by practising COVID-safe behaviours.

We invite families & children to join us at this year's Nayri Niara *Good Spirit* Festival - a connective experience for everyone.


The festival is held 22-25th April on the stunning cultural landscape of lunawuni/Bruny Island.


