Dear Families.

Welcome to the latest school newsletter.

Recently I have been revisiting the important work of Hugh van Cuylenburg from *The Resilience Project* and his messages of practising gratitude, empathy and mindfulness on a daily basis. One simple way to encourage this in the home is to change the phrase "how was your day today?" to "what went well for you today?" This simple change in language turns an open-ended question into one that encourages us to think from a place of gratitude and acknowledging some of the positive aspects of the day.

This weekend we will be participating in the 2022 Dark MOFO Ogohohog event in Hobart. We are one of only three schools that has been invited to decorate the Balinese bamboo masks that will be used on Sunday as part of the procession. Students are invited to be part of the procession but they *must* be accompanied and supervised by a parent throughout this event. Details of this event have already been sent home, but another copy of this can be found within the newsletter this week. I would like to thank Bu Ingrid and Naomi Buczek for their tremendous effort with planning and preparing for this event, as well as SeaLink for supporting our families and the community with additional ferry services so that we can engage with Dark MOFO again this year. We hope many of you can make it to this event.

In the coming weeks our families will be invited to attend a parent-teacher conversation to discuss the mid-year report. This invitation will be for either a face-to-face or telephone appointment. At this time we will share the new mid-year report format with you and have a conversation about your child's learning. We look forward to these meetings in a few weeks time.

This year our students will once again be involved with the Dark MOFO Ogoh-ogoh by decorating Balinese bamboo masks that will be included within the Ogoh-ogoh procession on Sunday June 19.

Students and their families are invited to attend the winter solstice burning on **Sunday June 19** and carry their masks in the big procession.

Students must be accompanied and supervised by a parent throughout this event.

Date: Sunday June 19, 2022

A few reminders:

- this is not a mini-parade like last year, but the full parade with everyone. We will be walking for 30 minutes and asked to sit during the burning
- you can leave with your child at any time
- please bring warm clothing (it will be cold)

Timeline:

4:30pm: Children with their families meet at Parliament Lawns.

5:30pm: Ogoh-ogoh procession starts (child and one parent)

6:00pm: At Cenotaph children sit in allocated spot to view burning of big Ogoh-ogoh.

By 7.00 pm: Event has concluded but families are welcome to leave at any time after the procession.

Parking is available 24/7 for \$3/hr at Macquarie Point pay and display carpark, look for signs and enter adjacent to Hobart Brewing Co, 16 Evans St.

This excursion was linked to our current Inquiry into Sea Country and to continue the important learning about why caring for Sea Country is so important.


The students were guided by Andrew Walsh—the Primary Schools Coordinator.

This year, you will notice some changes to reporting in Tasmanian Government Schools.

Firstly, you won't see A-E reporting any more for Prep to Year 10 students. Most families in Tasmanian Government Schools have told us that A-E reporting isn't meaningful enough for them. So, the Department is introducing a new 9-point visual scale.

For example:



Along with the visual scale a worded description will be included to help you understand how your child is going against the expected standard for their year level. The 9-point scale will show more specifically where your child is at with their learning.

The second main change you'll see is that teachers will be communicating with you more regularly throughout the year, instead of providing written comments on reports.

This more regular communication might be through online communication, telephone calls, or face-to-face conversations. By having more regular information about your child's learning progress you'll get a better understanding of how your child is going across the entire school year (not just twice a year).

Families will be supported to understand the new reporting requirements and the changes to mid and end of year report as they are implemented.
