CELEBRATION OF LEARNING: NAIDOC WEEK 2022



This year the students at Bruny Island District School have been learning about Sea Country, conducting inquiries into kelp deforestation, resource management, native foods and the effects of global warming on the environment and cultural heritage. In our classrooms and on the beautiful beaches of lunawanna-alonna, Bruny Island, on Nuenonne Country, we've learned about traditional Aboriginal practices and historic sites which have carried Culture and Country across tens of thousands of years, and how future generations are at risk of losing the resources necessary to continue learning, practicing and teaching their culture.

As a school community we choose to *Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!* for the protection of Aboriginal cultural heritage sites and resources, for sustainability and for the environment.

As part of our NAIDOC Week celebrations we created campaign posters to inform the wider community about environmental issues and Aboriginal causes we support and advocate for. Our posters were displayed at SETAC's NAIDOC Week Celebration at the Kingborough Community Hub last term.



The theme for this years disco is nature or punk


