INDONESIAN NEWS ACROSS THE CLASSROOMS



Our school is going to host an Indonesian teacher from our BRIDGE partnership School in Bandung, West Java. Bandung is a very cosmopolitan city with a very progressive mayor. The city has been undergoing a huge transformation with the city being planted out with many trees. Bandung is elevated and is an amazing area for growing tea and many other agricultural crops. It is often referred to as The Paris of Indonesia because of its sophistication. This is exciting news as the program has been on hold over the last two years due to COVID.

Ibu Novi, who teaches a grade four class, is arriving on the 28th October and will stay on Bruny Island until the 5th November.

During her stay she will visit and work with all classes, sharing information about her school and culture and working with our teachers.

Miss Shelton is our partnership teacher, and she will have the Until next time, Naomi Buczek opportunity to visit Bandung in 2023.

Our partnership school is SD Karangpawulang, the school population is 1000, so there will be many differences but also many similarities. We have had two exchange visits in the past with Mr Robinson and Mrs Waldon both travelling with myself to Bandung and hosting teachers from Indonesia in our homes.

There will be further information regarding Ibu Novi's visit closer to her time of arrival.

Last week Ingrid Colman once again worked with all classes, sharing her knowledge, language skills and enthusiasm for the teaching of Bahasa Indonesian.

She was impressed with the participation, courage and thinking from all students in the K/P/1 class, as they learnt traditional songs about The Family, in Indonesian.

The grade 1/2/3 class and the 4/5/6 class revised and consolidated their learnt vocabulary for this year. Students in both classes were thinkers and researchers as well as communicators sharing their information.

The 3/4/5/6 students are going to test their language skills through participating in a Poster Competition. The Year 3/4 topic is about themselves, including facial features, things they like and their family, all in Bahasa Indonesian. The Year 5/6 topic is Sekolah saya- My School. Students will use a comic strip style to share their information. They will impress the judges with correct spelling, word order, including interesting adjectives and illustrations which enhance the meaning of the text
