## WHAT LASTS?

Last week we went off-island as a whole school group to visit **putalina**. This excursion was planned to support our current inquiry of learning into the concept of permanency. We were learning as researchers. We were listening, wondering, documenting and asking further questions to better understand and to make meaning.













You might remember from our last newsletter that putalina is a site that has ongoing and longstanding significance to the Aboriginal community of Tasmania. It is a landscape rich in the evidence of occupation by Aboriginal people over thousands of years.

We were divided into two groups and had a very special guided tour around the lands and waterways of this site. We talked about the significant history of the site, the way the site was used to sustain life and culture and how this information has lasted over time.



We are incredibly proud of our students for engaging with our guides and asking important questions related to their learning. We have returned to school with many new questions and wonderings and we look forward to continuing our learning over the coming weeks.









## **KITCHEN - GARDEN LEARNING**

This term our Prep to Year 3 students are taking turns to cook within our Kitchen - Garden Learning programme. They are making various salads, various meals with potatoes and beautiful bread rolls.

Using produce from our school garden, we are teaching our students how to turn these raw, fresh ingredients into delicious meals that can be easily made and shared with others.

Let's make a difference together for Diabetes Australia— Tasmania because Kids Camps for children with Type I are super fun and super important.

My name is Isla Young and I have been attending these camps for kids with type I since I was 3.5 years old. They are great fun with action packed activities and every year I really look forward to catching up with some of my mates from all over Tasmania.

The volunteers who run the camps are amazing people and help me understand a bit more about managing my diabetes.

Did you know? Type I diabetes affects 5 times as many Tasmanian children as cancer. The cause of type I diabetes remains a mystery, with no known cure. You cannot prevent type I diabetes and once diagnosed you will live with it 24/7 for the rest of your life - requiring daily insulin, making up to 180 extra decisions a day about diabetes management, monitoring blood glucose levels and the list goes on.

This years' Schools Triathlon Challenge is challenging every participant to not only do their best and have fun, but to also help our Tasmanian children living with type I diabetes. Funds raised will go towards Diabetes Tasmania's youth program, which includes diabetes camps: there are 5 run through out the year from birth right through to young adults, helping every child transition through childhood, into the teen years and onto becoming a more independent young adult. Helping them to become more confident in self managing their diabetes. Thanks for your support!


