Our Tuesday Launching Into Learning has a focus on Gross Motor development. We support children to engage in whole body movements and to engage with each other to develop positive social interactions.

Our Thursday Launching Into Learning has a focus on Fine Motor development. We support children and families to engage in art, craft and musical explorations that develop the important and necessary skills required at this early age of development. We look forward to welcoming you to our Launching Into Learning sessions.



LOOSE PARTS PLAY

We are once again enjoying the creative minds of our students as we observe the interesting and wonderful developments that occur during recess and lunch time at the loose parts play corner.

Our students are learning as thinkers, self-managers, researchers, communicators, collaborators and contributors as they work together to construct their imaginative creations.

The learning that occurs during loose parts play crosses multiple curriculum areas. Not only is it a way of discovering different scientific concepts, it also encourages rich oral language and story telling experiences that we often see transfer into writing. There is plenty of maths and even some examples of history as the students tell stories that have "some" factual information from concepts they have heard about or read before.







GARDENING WITH YEAR 1-2-3



This year we have started strong with lovely weather on Friday mornings, which is our usual gardening time.

Students have been working collaboratively with Bob and parent helpers to harvest potatoes, weed, turn mulch, and water the garden beds in the school and community garden.

Each week we have discussed the importance of gardening and the benefits it has on our environment, community, and self. We have come up with great concepts to think about further, such as connection to place, healing of the land, sustainability, and benefits to mental and physical health.





At the end of each week, we put our pictures into our gardening book which can be found on display in the classroom for parents to read.

AEW: ABORIGINAL EDUCATION WORKER

This week with our Aboriginal Education Worker Hayley, we focused our learning on First Nations art techniques and discussed how art was traditionally created using natural resources found in the local environment.





We wondered which parts of different plants and animals were used to make paintings and etching tools. We explored our local area to collect banksia flowers, gumnuts, leaves, sticks and other natural resources to create our own art.

We spent time outside experimenting with different painting techniques – flicking, sponging, scratching and brushing paint onto our pages.



Our learning helped us connect with and create with Country while acknowledging the ancient knowledges, traditions and methods inspiring us today.



Our Kinders and Preps have started exploring the concept of special places on Country – a learning journey we've begun by reading Nel Smit's book My Patch and by finding our own special patch at school to observe, care for and connect with over the year.

Our patch is a grassy area between a beautiful old gum tree and a big tree stump which both provide habitat and evidence of seasonal changes.

Hayley takes our students to our patch in small groups to put our hands and our eyes to the ground, to feel the earth and notice our visitors which today included a ladybeetle, some new flowers, a bee and the star of the show – a giant mushroom!

KITCHEN-GARDEN LEARNING

Things are heating up in the Kitchen with the Kitchen-Garden Learning program well underway; cooking delicious meals from our School Garden.

At the moment we are utilising an abundance of zucchini, beetroot, onions and herbs.

Each fortnight I will share a recipe from our menu, and today features *Zucchini Feta and Herb Pie*, which was very popular with the children last week and is a great way to use up a zucchini that have blown out of proportion!

Zucchini, Feta and Herb Pie

- 700g grated zucchini (remove the seedy centre before weighing and grating)
- 5 eggs
- ½ Cup olive oil
- I cup chopped chives or spring onions or any mild onion.
- ½ Cup fresh herbs chopped (eg: parsley, basil, thyme, oregano)
- 220g feta crumbled
- I50g parmesan grated
- Salt and pepper
- I ½ Cups Self raising flour (substitute with Gluten free variety if needed)
- I. Preheat your oven to 180 degrees. Butter a 22cm square tin.
- 2. Pile grated zucchini into a colander and place weights on top to squeeze out any moisture. Let sit while you prepare other ingredients.
- 3. Whisk eggs, add oil, chives, herbs.
- 4. Squeeze zucchini even more and stir into egg mix.
- 5. Crumble in the feta and parmesan, salt and pepper to taste.
- 6. Add flour and mix.
- 7. Spread into tin and sprinkle with extra cheese.
- 8. Bake approx. I hour or until golden and firm to touch.

We will also be making some preserves in the kitchen over the coming months to sell at the school fair so if you have clean, label free jars with metal lids and/or excess produce that we could preserve (rhubarb, tomatoes, berries, beetroot etc), feel free to drop at the school office and we shall get busy!
