BRUNY ISLAND SCHOOL SUN SMART POLICY

At Bruny Island District School we are committed to ensuring the safety of all students and includes making sure we adhere to the requirements of our Sun Smart Policy. The Sun Smart Policy was developed in consultation and with support of Cancer Council Tasmania and follows legislation and standards provided by the Work Health and Safety Act.



Our Policy reminds us that in Tasmania, sun protection is required when the UV levels are 3 or more. In Tasmania, the UV is 3 and above from September to April (and sometimes into May). Our

school will therefore continue to monitor the UV level each day. When it reaches 3 or more throughout Term 2, we will ask students to wear a hat during recess and lunch time.

Please make sure your child continues to have their school hat with them during Term 2. Thank you.

KITCHEN-GARDEN LEARNING

We launched into our Autumn menu this week with the first round of mini *Master Chefs* brimming with enthusiasm to get back into the kitchen.

The garden is coming along beautifully thanks to some donations of healthy seedlings from Jo Smith and Eleonora Buczek. All of the winter crops still have a way to go before they are ready for harvesting but we have an abundance of greens, leeks and herbs with which we can still cook up a feast.

Our Autumn menu consists of Pesto Pizza (this week we made our pesto with luscious silverbeet leaves), caramelised leek, the last of the zucchini and plenty of fresh herbs (oregano, thyme and rosemary). The pizzas are accompanied by a green garden salad which this week consisted of lettuce, baby silverbeet, baby beetroot leaves, mustard greens, rocket, chives, mint and chickweed!

Many of you may not realise that Chickweed (Stellaria media) is in fact edible and highly nutritious. This common 'weed' loves moist, shady spots and is growing in abundance in our veg patch at school.

The chooks love it and so do we, sprinkled through our green salad. There are a couple of other weeds which look quite similar to Chickweed, which are poisonous so be very careful when harvesting for the first time. The tell-tale sign to identify chickweed is that it has a very fine line of hairs running down the stem which look a little like a mohawk!

We dressed our salad with a very simple vinaigrette made of 1/4 cup apple cider vinegar, 1/4 cup olive oil, I tablespoon maple syrup and salt and pepper to taste. You won't believe how many kids gobble up all of their green salad when it is topped with this tangy dressing.

Next week Rory and I plan to make a giant hot compost heap which comes together like a big layered garden waste lasagne! We have several ingredients to build it with including horse manure, grass clippings, autumn leaves, shredded paper, kitchen scraps and straw (kindly donated by Leigh Blackwell and transported by Aaron Archer).



The Grade 4/5/6 class will learn all about turning waste products into rich garden compost which we can then cycle back through the garden to grow top notch veg to feed the kids. If there are any parents who would be willing to volunteer on a Wednesday afternoon and learn about making hot compost next week please let me know. We get out into the garden from 2pm-3pm, weather permitting. You will need to have a current Working with Vulnerable People card to volunteer.

Other ways you can help this Kitchen Garden to flourish are by donating any of the following (all the money we save by not having to buy these items, helps us to stretch the budget further for the kids):

 seed potatoes, chives (maybe you have a clump you could divide), rosemary (just one or two small plants to fill a herb bed), a salad spinner, some glass tumblers and a metal or silicone egg flip (maybe you have some items gathering dust in the back of the kitchen cupboard- it is always worth asking).
