#### FIRST NATIONS LEARNING

At Bruny Island District School we are proud to support an educational focus on the history, culture and resilience of our First Nations people. We are privileged to be guided by our Aboriginal Education Worker, Hayley, and by the resources provided both by our Department for Education, Children and Young people, and those from our local community.

In recent weeks we have acknowledged and focused our attention on Sorry Day, Reconciliation Week and continued our inquiry learning which is focused on the 2023 NAIDOC Week theme—For Our Elders.

#### **NATIONAL SORRY DAY**



On Friday 26 May we acknowledged and paid respects to Sorry Day. We invited students to wear something purple and hosted a gathering at the flag pole to remember the mistreatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People. National Sorry Day is a day to consider the strength of the Stolen Generation survivors and reflect on how Australian's can continue to

play a part in the healing process for the people and the nation.

We related this to our school motto of We Care. During our gathering I invited our school to consider our motto. We Care for each other. We Care for our environment. We Care for ourselves. We Care for those that have suffered mistreatment.





#### **NATIONAL RECONCILIATION DAY**

This week we are acknowledging National Reconciliation Week and the theme of: **Be a Voice for Generations**. This theme invites us to learn about our shared history, culture, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

In the lead up to this week, our students have been learning as researchers and thinkers, but this week they were sharing as contributors at our Reconciliation Day Assembly. Our students considered what the theme means for us and shared their learning about racism and reconciliation.

The word reconciliation means to apologise without reservation. To really mean what you say and 'the restoration of friendly relations'.

our school. It is because of this collaboration that we are able to provide these rich learning experiences for our students.
























#### **PROBLEM SOLVING**






## NATIONAL SIMULTATEOUS STORYTIME

There will be no teacher comments in the report.



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


